Our success comes from a carefully planned and well- rounded fundraising strategy.

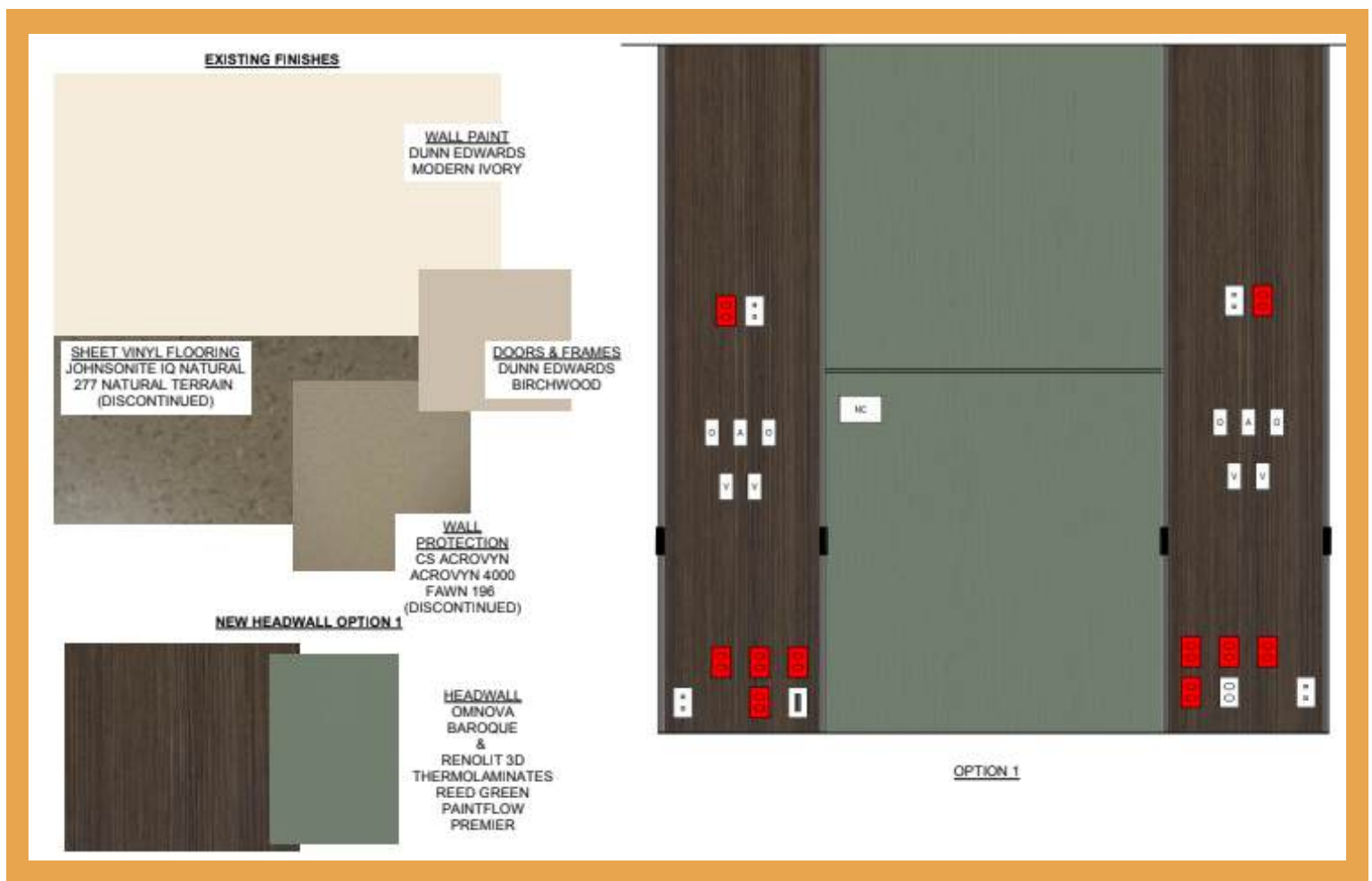

The modernization project is critical for enhancing patient care at Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital. These funds will be directly applied to replacing and upgrading the entire headwall systems within the ICCU, providing our medical staff with state-of-the-art infrastructure essential for delivering the highest standard of critical care. We extend our deepest gratitude to every donor, partner, and volunteer who contributed to this monumental achievement.



Careful consideration was given to every aesthetic and functional detail during the design phase of the ICCU modernization. This included strategic choices for the advanced headwalls, which are central to patient care delivery, as well as the durable and cleanable flooring, high-performance countertops, and soothing paint colors, all **meticulously selected to support patient recovery and enhance the efficiency of medical staff.** In the rendering above, you can see an early glimpse of these design choices for the Headwalls, flooring, countertops, and paint, showcasing the thoughtful planning involved.

TOP RURAL HOSPITAL



We are proud to share that Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital is one of only 15 rural hospitals nationwide to be honored with the prestigious Top Rural Hospital Award. Presented by The Leapfrog Group, this recognition highlights hospitals with exceptional systems to prevent medication errors, provide high-quality maternity care, and maintain lower infection rates, among other measures of excellence. Even more remarkable, Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital is among the very few to receive this honor two years in a row—in both 2023 and 2024—a true testament to our team's unwavering commitment to patient safety and quality care.

5 STARS FROM MEDICARE

Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital earned a coveted 5-star rating from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS). This places us among an elite group of just 36 hospitals in California to receive this distinction. These ratings are based on rigorous quality measures, encompassing critical aspects of healthcare delivery. Our CMS 5-star status is a testament to our unwavering commitment to excellence and the result of years of dedication to continuous improvement and an unyielding commitment to patient care.

“A” HOSPITAL SAFETY GRADE BY THE LEAPFROG GROUP THREE YEARS IN A ROW

In Spring 2025, Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital once again earned an “A” Hospital Safety Grade from The Leapfrog Group, a nationally respected nonprofit watchdog dedicated to advancing healthcare quality and transparency. This top grade, awarded only to hospitals that meet the highest standards across more than 30 measures of performance, reflects our unwavering commitment to patient safety and quality care. Achieving our second consecutive “A” rating is not only a significant honor but also a powerful affirmation of the skill, dedication, and compassion of our physicians, nurses, and staff.

SNMH RECEIVED TWO STROKE CARE AWARDS



This year, Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital (SNMH) received two distinguished recognitions from the American Heart Association’s Get With The Guidelines® program. Firstly, SNMH earned the Stroke Gold Plus award—as part of Dignity Health’s Northern California Division—for achieving at least two consecutive years of $\geq 85\%$ adherence to all stroke achievement measures and $\geq 75\%$ on select quality metrics, including rapid response and coordinated care protocols. Secondly, SNMH was recognized with the Rural Stroke Bronze award in acknowledgment of its dedicated efforts to improve stroke outcomes in rural communities through guideline-driven care and streamlined EMS coordination.

Leaving a Lasting Legacy

A Legacy of Service and Impact

Chuck Coover had an office in our same building for many years and I was always greeted with a warm hello. I remember taking a call from him in December of 2023. Chuck was very grateful for the care he and his family had received and he wanted to make an end of year donation as a grateful patient. Not too long after that phone call I received notice that Chuck had passed and left SNMH Foundation in his estate. I was somewhat surprised that we were named as a beneficiary with Chuck's long time service to other local nonprofits.



Chuck was a man of service, giving back with his time and expertise. His passion was supporting families and children, especially those affected by substance use challenges. Chuck served as a CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocate) for over a decade. He was on the board of Community Recovery Resources, now Granite Wellness. Chuck served as a member of the board of the Child Abuse Council, a member of Multi Disciplinary Interview Team (MDIT), and also the Sacramento Regional Child Abuse Council, which covers 14 Northern California counties.

Writing this, I am reminded of the final song in *Hamilton*, "Who lives, who dies, who tells your story." I feel honored to help share Chuck's story and his legacy as a grateful patient and his legacy of impact for our community.
