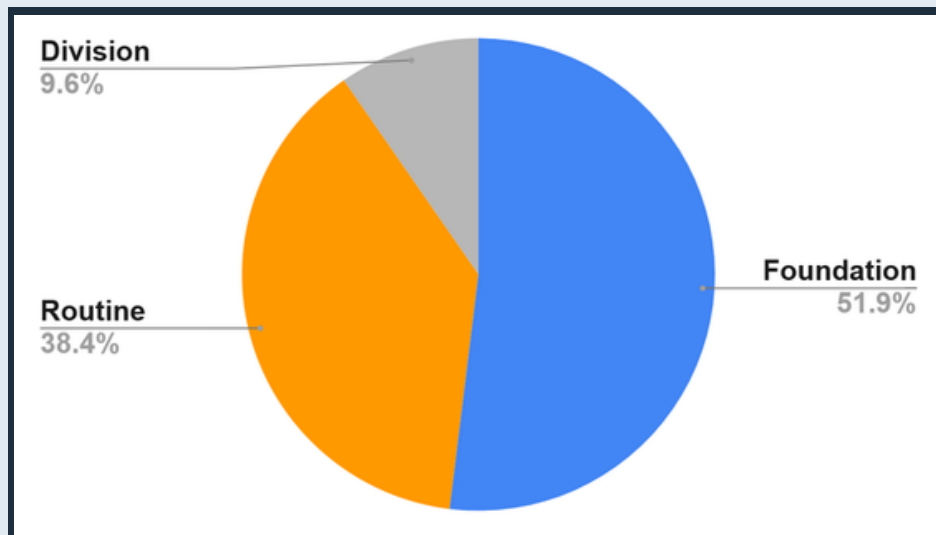

Hospital Capital Spending

While the hospital and system make capital investments in Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital, a significant portion of this spending results from the generous support of donations through the SNMH Foundation. For the fiscal year, total capital spending reached \$1.1 million*, with the majority of these funds originating from the SNMH Foundation. Departments benefiting from this year's capital investments include Surgery, Ambulance, Nursing, Imaging, Respiratory Therapy, Family Birth Center, Emergency Department, Education, Laboratory, general plant operations, and Cardiology and Cardiac Rehab. *This figure does not include programatic investments

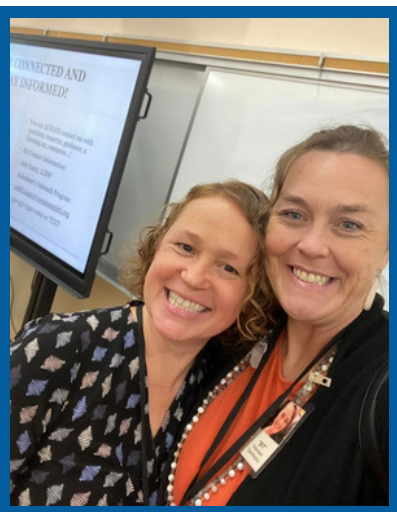
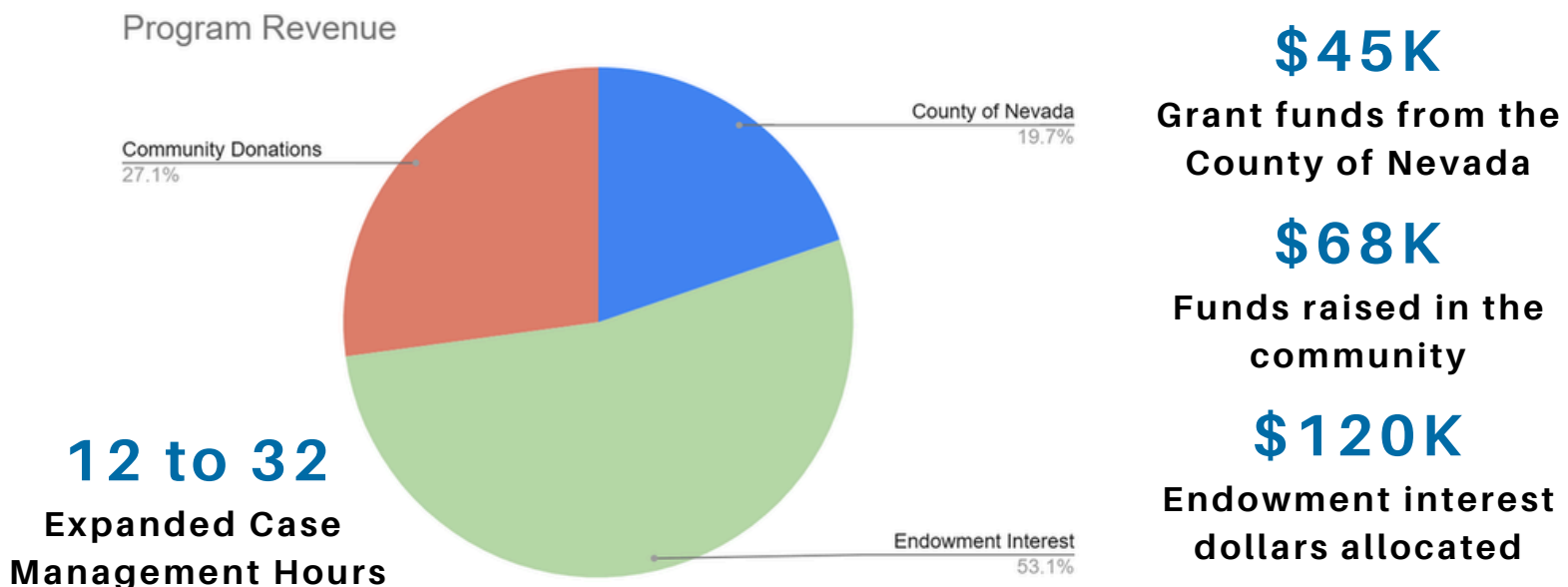

Expanding Alzheimer's Care

This year SNMH Foundation focused on increasing access to support for family caregivers with a loved one with Alzheimer's or a related dementia. A tremendous amount of advocacy, business planning, and fundraising focused on expanding the case management hours and fundraising for future expansion of educational workshops and respite for families.

This was made possible by a strategic, three-point funding model including a contract with the County of Nevada, utilizing interest earned from our Endowment Fund, as well as incredible support from our community.



Expanding Cancer Support

With donor support, we were able to bring back the beloved Writing to Heal support group for our Cancer patients. Courtney Ferguson stepped up to offer to lead the class and bring it back to life.

"Each time our Writing to Heal group meets, we share a sense of personal discovery. Prompts are given. Some are lighthearted, while others are more thought-provoking. Participants write their responses, and they are often surprised by their own creativity. Personal insights can be a source of inspiration for everyone. Since confidentiality is key, whatever may be shared stays in the room," said Courtney Ferguson, Support Group Facilitator.

ICCU Project Update

CONSTRUCTION STARTING JULY 2026

The long-awaited construction of the ICCU Modernization project is set to commence this July. This fiscal year, significant progress was made in scoping the project for seismic retrofit designs, securing approval from HCAI (the state certifying body), engaging a local contractor, and ordering essential supplies such as Headwalls. We are pleased to announce that official construction will soon begin.

The team has meticulously planned for a safe and efficient continuum of care, with the unit undergoing renovation of five rooms at a time. The project's initial phase will involve the installation of an additional electrical panel, followed by the renovation of rooms six through eight. Phase two will then focus on rooms one through five. The entire project remains on track for completion by December 2026.

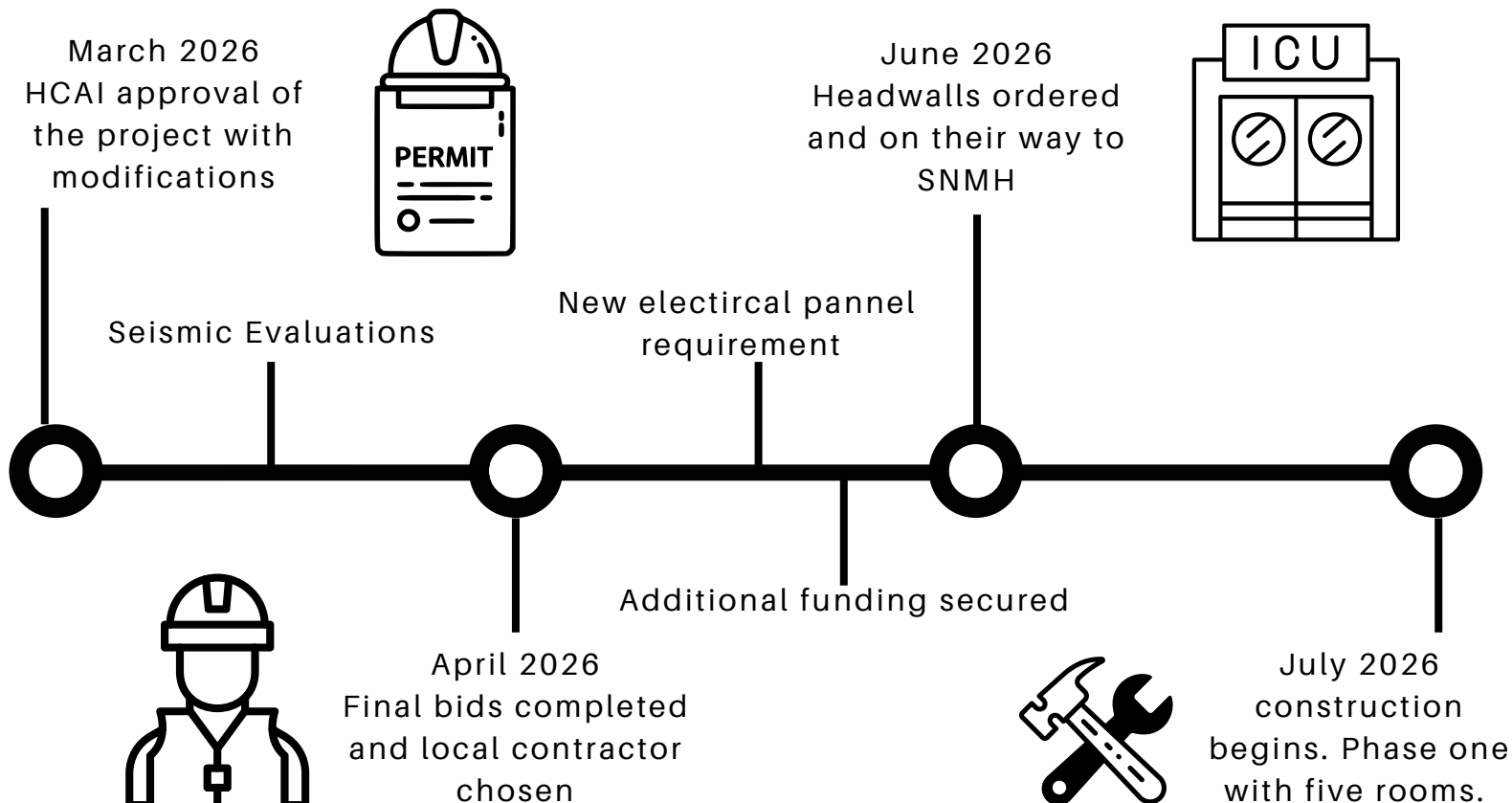

Family Medicine Residency

First Graduates Stay Local

Dignity Health Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital, a member of CommonSpirit Health, and Chapa-De Indian Health partnered together to establish the Residency Program in rural Nevada County. Founded in 2023, the three-year program aims to enhance access to high-quality, comprehensive healthcare for rural communities by providing physician training in a rural healthcare setting.

As the first round of residents from the program are preparing to complete their training this summer, they are choosing to stay local as full-time physicians. Following three years of training under physicians in both hospital and clinic settings, Dr. Kelty White and Dr. Nick Sparr have built strong ties to the Grass Valley community. They are excited to continue their careers serving the community that embraced them as residents and the Residency Program.

Dr. Nick Sparr said the success of the program is due to the efforts of everyone involved, "It wasn't just the physicians we worked with who were incredibly supportive of training residents, but also all the staff we encountered—nursing staff, medical assistants, and administrators. Everyone seemed to buy in right away. I think that's fairly unique to this environment and to this community." For Dr. Kelty White, working in rural primary care was always the goal, and her experience in the residency program solidified her ambitions. "There is a lot of variety and opportunity for gaining a wider breadth of practice areas in a rural location. Working with other physicians and specialists to develop plans that meet individual patient needs is special, and I am looking forward to continuing that practice as a physician in this community."

Dr. Kelty White will join Chapa-De Indian Health as a full-time primary care physician, and Dr. Nick Sparr will split his time between Dignity Health Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital as a hospitalist and Chapa-De Indian Health as an on-call physician. The Sierra Nevada Family Medicine Residency Program will welcome its fourth round of residents this summer, continuing to create a legacy of addressing the needs of rural communities through comprehensive, compassionate care.

Family Medicine Residency

Creating a Program of Excellence

Published Case Studies

While we are a rural, community-based residency program, both of our residents have published case reports in peer-reviewed journals. Dr. White was an intern when she participated in the care of a patient who presented to the clinic with so much fluid dripping from their nose that they required a face mask to secure a washcloth to her face to staunch the continuous flow of clear fluid from her right nostril. She had developed daily headaches, and frequent emergency department visits did not reveal the diagnosis. A high clinical suspicion ultimately led to the diagnosis of a cerebral spinal fluid leak. Dr. White and her colleagues, under the clinical supervision of one of our urban senior residents, Dr. Antes, and our urban faculty, Dr. Nancy Nguyen, wrote a case report about this unique presentation and frequently missed diagnosis.

Dr. Sparr was on the inpatient service as the program director when they encountered a young woman in her early 40s who presented with septic shock. She had recently had surgery for a foot fracture after a fall on some bleachers. A few weeks later, she experienced complications, including a blood clot, but that was not enough to explain why she was so sick. Dr. Sparr was persistent and questioned the CT scan that didn't provide a definitive answer, pushing for an MRI. The MRI revealed a rare case of pyomyositis that required multiple surgeries to correct and save the patient's leg and life. Dr. Sparr not only pushed for the appropriate care of this patient but also went through the rigorous exercise of publishing the case report to educate future clinicians about this condition.

Professional Development

Two, and soon to be three, residents have been Medical Education Research Foundation Scholars for the California Society for Addiction Medicine. They started a weekly resident-run Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) group where they treat patients with opioid use disorder.

Community Service

Dr. Haugen did a rotation focused on palliative care on the Navajo Reservation. Working in palliative care on the Navajo Reservation requires navigating a unique intersection of federal healthcare systems, expansive rural geography, and rich cultural traditions. Providers must balance modern pain management and advance care planning with deep respect for Indigenous beliefs about end-of-life care and the dying process. Residents volunteer in the community for prostate cancer screenings, skin cancer screenings, advanced care directive educational events, and high school sports physical clinics.
