Your Kindness in Action: FY 22 - 23

Residency Program:

After several years of planning and development, the Sierra Nevada Family Medicine Residency Program became a reality this year. The program is officially nationally accredited and the first two residents matched to the program. This fiscal year the community helped raise \$300,000 to kick start the program.

Dr. Nicolas Sparrs and Dr. Kelty White were celebrated with a welcome ceremony and gala event. Dr. Sparrs and Dr. White will begin their first year of training primarily at our partner hospital Methodist Hospital of Sacramento with rotations to Chapa De Indian Health and the Hospital. Year two and three of the program will be in our community.

The program will match the next two resident physicians in March of 2024. By 2025, there will be six family practice physicians training in the community.

Alzheimer's Outreach Program (AOP):

It is estimated that there are about 3,000 residents in our service area with Alzheimer's or related dementia. The day-to-day challenges of family care giving are immense. Our Alzheimer's Outreach Program is making a significant difference locally.

This fiscal year the AOP held 39 family caregiver support groups, 21 families received respite care, 285 clients received educational programing, 60 home visits took place, and 125 clients referrals were served.

This year, we introduced a new pilot program - educational classes designed to enhance the understanding of dementia among local law enforcement. Linda Aechliman, our AOP Education Coordinator, spearheaded a class specifically tailored for the sheriff's office. The objective is to equip first responders with the knowledge and skills needed to effectively handle situations involving individuals with dementia, while also providing support to their caregivers.

SNMH Ambulance:

This year donor and grant support provided a major boost to the Ambulance Department. Donor support from our "Area of Greatest Need" Fund purchased a brand new Ambulance for the community.

In addition, grant funding from the Del E. Webb Foundation outfitted our Ambulance fleet with an advanced communication system that has enhanced GPS ability, a texting capability with dispatch, and a better ability to communicate with other first responders such as CALFIRE.

The Ambulance Department also received a brand new tool to help save lives - the Lucas Chest Compression System. This device has been shown to improve quality of chest compressions, increase CO2 levels, as well as being able to sustain life-saving circulation during prolonged resuscitation attempts.
