TOP RURAL HOSPITAL

or the second year in a row, Dignity Health Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital has been honored as a Top Rural Hospital, one of only 15 hospitals in the United States to achieve this award. The prestigious recognition, awarded by The Leapfrog

Group, highlights exceptional patient care in categories such as infection rates, safer surgery practices, maternity care, and the prevention of medication errors.

"Achieving the Leapfrog Top Hospital award in two consecutive years demonstrates our determination to provide the safest and highest quality care," says Dr. Scott Neeley, SNMH President and CEO. "This is a promise our entire team believes in and delivers on daily."

Dr. Neeley's trust in SNMH's care is deeply personal. "When I needed major surgery, I chose SNMH because I trust our team. That same trust is what every member of our community can feel, knowing they are cared for by their neighbors and loved ones."

Beyond the Top Rural Hospital honor, SNMH earned recognition as a 5-Star Hospital by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) and was placed on California's Opioid and Patient Safety Honor Rolls for preventing harm related to opioid use and hospital-acquired conditions.

SNMH also achieved a milestone in patient safety, going four years without a central line bloodstream infection from intravenous catheters. "This places us in the top 1% of U.S. hospitals for this critical safety category," Dr. Neeley shares.

Looking ahead, Dr. Neeley emphasizes that SNMH's mission extends beyond hospital walls. "We're building coalitions with the County and partners to support healthy living and increase not just lifespan, but healthspan—years lived in good health, independence, and activity."

Dr. Neeley concludes, "Quality care has no finish line. We remain committed to continuous improvement, earning the trust and support of our community every day."

ICCU FUNDING SURPASSED

Improving Critical Care


The Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital Foundation is thrilled to announce the successful completion of its fundraising campaign to modernize the Hospital's Intensive Critical Care Unit (ICCU).

The ICCU, a 10-bed facility that served 1,604 patients in the 2023 fiscal year, will undergo upgrades to enhance patient care, improve nursing efficiency, and provide greater comfort to families. Key improvements include upgraded headwall designs, advanced telemetry systems, state-of-the-art technology, and seismic retrofits.

To lead this important project, the Hospital has hired Project Manager Ben Burns, who brings 25 years of expertise in healthcare construction. His leadership will ensure the modernization is strategically executed, maximizing efficiency and patient-centered improvements.

"The project team is evaluating the area for any seismic upgrade needs, preparing the drawings and plans, meeting monthly, and working on the process to submit the plans to HCAI for approvals," said Sandra Barrington, Executive Director of SNMH Foundation.

This project builds on the Foundation's commitment to improving critical care, following the 2020 Emergency Department transformation and Surgery Department upgrades. Thank you to all donors and supporters for making this vital transformation possible!



ALZHEIMER'S OUTREACH PROGRAM Setting Sights on Expansion

In FY24, the Alzheimer's Outreach Program(AOP) provided essential support to individuals and caregivers affected by memory impairments. Key activities included one-on-one crisis care, case management, caregiver education, and community outreach. Additionally, respite care funds were made available to families in need, ensuring access to critical support at no cost. The program provided 285 client contacts offering vital resources to enhance their quality of life. Of that, 50 families received ongoing one-on-one support.



In FY25, the program aims to continue providing comprehensive support through educational and clinical components, maintaining its commitment to those impacted by Alzheimer's and other memory disorders. Planned activities remain consistent, ensuring ongoing crisis care, case management, caregiver education, outreach, and respite care funding to meet the needs of the community.

Looking ahead, we need to expand the AOP program to full-time to better support the growing need in our community and are actively seeking sustainable funding options to ensure its long-term success. The reality is, the need for caregiver support is immense. Our friends and neighbors need more support. We have to help as many family caregivers as possible.

RESIDENCY PROGRAM UPDATES

Intensive Care Unit Rotation

The success of the Sierra Nevada Family Medicine Program continues. Becoming a teaching community for primary care physicians was no small feat, taking years of planning, vetting, partnership development, fundraising, and community ownership. Chapa-De Indian Health has been an incredible partner in this journey. Thank you to everyone in our community who has helped develop this vital program to bring more physicians to western Nevada County.

This year marks an incredible milestone for the program. 2025 will see the program come to full capacity with six residents in training starting in July. Recently, residents Dr. Nick Sparr and Dr. Kelty White completed a rotations in the Intensive Critical Care Unit. Under the guidance and supervision of Dr. Michelle Newsom, Dr. Sparr received airway management training in caring for the critically ill.



GRATEFUL PATIENT STORY Kindness in Cardiac Rehab

Dr. Robert Haight, a western Nevada County resident, experienced the SNMH Cardiac Rehab Program firsthand. "As I was in the recovery room after a stent procedure in a Bay Area hospital, I was trying to understand why, after years of annual cardiac exams, there was no clue that I had a 95% blockage of my right coronary artery," Dr. Haight recalls. "After a while my thoughts turned to 'what else is wrong with my vascular system' and 'how do I return to an active lifestyle of work and exercise safely.'"

"I continued to ruminate about my concerns," he says. "As I reviewed my discharge package at home I saw a brochure for a Medicare-sponsored cardiac rehab program at SNMH. I called the director, who gave me a description of the 12-week program. It sounded like the controlled exercise and detailed monitoring was exactly what I believed I needed to safely resume an active life. The extensive medical monitoring during the entire program provides the staff with the ability

to detect anomalies and immediately address the issue with the patient," Dr. Haight says. "The staff at the hospital are nothing short of amazing."


SNMH 32ND GOLF CLASSIC
