EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT Ultrasound Funded

The SNMH Emergency Department team received a special holiday present this year in the form of a new point-of-care ultrasound. \$30,000 was raised from 43 donors.


Patients in the Emergency Department will now be able to have bedside ultrasound procedures instead of having to be transported to the radiology department. Having a bedside ultrasound will expedite diagnosis and patients will be on a treatment path in a more timely manner. The equipment will also allow the physicians to rapidly rule out or diagnose

common stomach ailments.

Gifts made from October 1, 2015-December 31, 2015










CURRENT FUNDING FOCUSES

SNMH Foundation is raising \$122,000 for additional MRI (Magnetic resonance imaging) equipment that will be located in the main Hospital. Additionally, \$70,000 for upgraded technology is needed for the Women and Infant Care Unit (WICU).

27% Toward MRI Goal



Magnetic resonance imaging is a technique that uses a magnetic field and radio waves to create detailed images of the organs and tissues within your body. SNMH has the only MRI within a 45 minute drive and the unit is being used continuously.

In FY2014 SNMH conducted 3,317 MRI studies.

Having an additional MRI in the main hospital will:


- Reduce wait times for patients

\$70,000 Needed for Labor and Delivery Technology

SNMH Foundation has started raising funds for the Women and Infant Care Unit to help purchase new technology necessary for labor and delivery and newborn care. \$3,000 has been raised so far in this fiscal year.
