MOBILE CLINIC COMING SOON

The SNMH Foundation is thrilled to announce the launch of a new state-of-the-art mobile clinic aimed at expanding healthcare access in our community. Funded through federal appropriations by the late Senator Dianne Feinstein, who also supported electronic health record expansion locally in the early 2000s, this mobile unit will bring walk-in, acute care services directly to neighborhoods where they are most needed.

Designed to reduce barriers to care, the clinic will offer non-emergency services such as treatment for cold and flu symptoms, seasonal allergies, minor infections, cuts, sprains, and other minor injuries. It will also provide sports physicals and point-of-care testing including strep A, RSV, flu, COVID-19, pregnancy, nebulizer treatments, acute pain management, and ear lavages.

The mobile clinic will be delivered to the SNMH campus soon and will be available for tours. It is expected to be fully operational, permitted and certified by January 2026.

The Hospital is working with the Nevada County Mobile Health Coalition, a collaborative effort with local partners including Nevada County Public Health, Western Sierra Medical Clinic, the Superintendent of Schools, Bright Futures for Youth, the Family Resource Center, Hospitality House, Yuba Harm Reduction Collective, and Partnership Health Plan. Together, the coalition is focused on coordinated outreach, sustainable solutions, and reducing health disparities across the county.

INVESTING IN CRITICAL CARE: ICCU PROJECT UPDATE



The modernization of the Intensive Critical Care Unit has reached an important milestone-the completion of the design phase. The design phase for an Intensive Critical Care Unit (ICCU) headwall project involves a multifaceted approach that prioritizes functionality, safety, and patient well-being.

The design phase takes into account placement and accessibility of equipment for clinical staff; infection control such as selecting smooth, easy to clean surfaces; patient safety and comfort such as noise reduction, lighting, as well as balancing the comfort of the patients with the needs of clinical staff; and, specific functionality such as medical gas outlets, electrical outlets, data and communication connections, equipment rails, storage, and other specialized needs of an ICCU.

With careful consideration, the design team is ensuring that our upgraded ICCU can be created in a safe, efficient, and comfortable environment.

When Melissa Collins moved to Grass Valley in 2019, she had no idea how much she'd come to rely on Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital (SNMH). Over the past six years, she has visited nearly every department—from X-ray and mammography to surgery and the Emergency Room—and throughout it all, she's been met with exceptional care and compassion.

Her journey began with a skiing accident that led to a surprising osteoporosis diagnosis. Melissa now receives annual infusions at SNMH, and she praises the Infusion Center for its kindness and professionalism—highlighting a nurse who even called to check in after her first treatment.

During the height of the pandemic, Melissa underwent a hysterectomy at the SNMH Surgery Center. Though her husband couldn't be with her due to restrictions, the staff made her feel safe and supported.

Most recently, a kitchen accident brought her to the Emergency Room, where she was in and out in just 30 minutes—another reminder of how fortunate she feels to have such reliable care close to home.


PINK PATCH MONTH
